What will be analyzed?

Farmers participating in the Great Lakes YEN will agree to collect soil, tissue, and grain samples at specific times throughout the duration of the project and send them to a lab for analyses.

Analyses and benchmarking will include:

- · Agronomic and management data
- Soil samples
- Tissue samples
- Grain composition
- · Weather and soil data
